

Al Dennis was appointed as FDLE's Inspector General on January 8, 2004. Al is responsible for managing and supervising the Office of Inspector General and providing a central point of coordination for activities that promote accountability, integrity, and efficiency in FDLE. Al has a wealth of experience in all areas of law enforcement and has served FDLE in various capacities for the last 25 years. He most recently served as Administrator of Public Information and Special Programs, acting as the spokesperson for FDLE on statewide issues involving the Department's programs, services, and initiatives. In addition he served as the FDLE Accreditation Manager, D.A.R.E. statewide coordinator and oversaw the administration of the program and supervised all D.A.R.E. related activities. Additional positions held by Al at FDLE include Special Agent Supervisor, Special Agent, D.A.R.E. Regional Coordinator, and Personnel Services Specialist. Shortly following his appointment Al joined the Association of Inspector's General (AIG) and attended the Inspector's General Institute's certification course in Chicago, IL (March 1-5, 2004) and received his certificate as a Certified Inspector's General (CIG). He is also a member of the Tallahassee Chapter of the Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA).

Al received his Bachelor degree from Florida State University in Criminology and is a graduate of FDLE's Foundation Leadership Program (Charter Class) and Special Agent Academy. In addition, Al is a Certified Master Facilitator and a graduate of Leadership Tallahassee. He received the 2002 Commissioner's Award. In January 2006, Al was honored as a Distinguished Alumni during Tallahassee Community College's African-American History Month.
