

Bob has worked in law enforcement and accountability assurance positions for more than 35 years.

During a 24-year U.S. Air Force career, Bob served as an enlisted security policeman, a commissioned police shift commander and Special Agent with the Air Force Office of Special Investigations (OSI). Bob served as the commander of two OSI units; Griffiss Air Force Base, New York and Eglin Air Force Base, Florida. While serving as a Special Agent, Bob focused on conducting and leading Department of Defense procurement fraud and crimes against persons investigations. Bob also served as OSI's Federal Liaison officer in Washington DC, responsible for maintaining relations with foreign police attaches assigned in the United States.

Bob began his State career in 1997 as the Director of Investigations for the Florida Department of Transportation's Office of Inspector General.
